History of Science doctoral students are eligible for financial support of up to \$750 to fund travel to academic conferences to deliver a paper (or serve on a panel) in every year in which they are enrolled and in good standing. Students may apply for more than one conference per year, with awards subject to the overall funding limitations described below. The department endeavors to support all eligible applicants for conference travel funding.

Application Deadline: Rolling

Applications *must* be submitted at least one month in advance of planned travel and will generally be processed within 60 days of submission.

Instructions for Applicants

1. Submit completed applications to the Graduate Program Coordinator. Applications must be co-signed by the applicant's advisor. Note: graduate program coordinator also accepts advisor approval via email.
2. Forward email notification from the conference organizers (or staff) that your paper has been accepted for presentation. A conference program showing participation is an acceptable form of documentation.
3. Please note: ***There is a \$5,000 limit on combined departmental funding for each DHS doctoral student.*** This limit includes Hiebert and Strominger Fellowships for Conference Travel, Hiebert and Strominger Dissertation Research and Technical Training awards, and Oral History Project funds.
