**Erwin N. Hiebert Fellowship**  
**for Dissertation Research and Technical Training &**  
**Matthew B. Strominger, '81 Prize Fellowship**

History of Science students at the dissertation stage are eligible to apply for financial support of up to \$2,500 (\$1500 for post generals summer support) to travel to an archive (or equivalent) for dissertation research or to undertake technical training, including advanced language training for dissertation research.

**Application Deadlines:**

1. Rolling for research or training completed or expected to be completed between June 1, 2021 and June 1, 2022.
2. **June 15, 2022** for research or training to be carried out between June 2 and August 31, 2022; *and* for post-generals 2022 summer research or training in support of thesis prospectus preparation.

**Eligibility:**

For academic year research funding, the department will consider applicants with an approved dissertation prospectus; for technical training, students who have passed generals *and* those with an approved prospectus will be considered. Students seeking post-generals summer funding must have passed the general exam.

**Terms:**

1. Grants will be disbursed in full when awarded; note processing can take up to 60 days.
2. Priority will be given to students who have not previously received Hiebert or Strominger Fellowship funding.
3. The maximum award is \$2,500 (\$1,500 for post-generals summer research).
4. ***There is a \$5,000 limit on combined departmental funding for each History of Science doctoral student.*** This limit includes Hiebert and Strominger Conference Travel Fellowships, Hiebert Dissertation Research and Technical Training Fellowships, Strominger Prize Fellowships, and Oral History funding.

Students usually will be notified of the outcome of their application within one month of submission

**Instructions for Applicants:**

Complete the attached application form and submit it along with a one-page project proposal at least 30 days in advance of archival travel or technical training to the Graduate Program Coordinator. Applications must be co-signed by the applicant's primary advisor; *advisor approvals may also consist of e-mails to the Graduate Program Coordinator.* Complete applications will be processed within 60 days.
